This April is oral cancer awareness month. I am very passionate in talking about this, as I have seen several cases over my years as a dentist, and also my aunt was diagnosed several years ago. She has had to undergo three surgeries to remove a growth on her tongue, that then had spread to her jaw. After the growth to her jaw, she had to have several teeth removed and part of her jawbone. She is in her 70's and had quit smoking and drinking of any sort, in her late 20's. Her dr. thinks that she was exposed to the Human Papilloma Virus(HPV) at one point in her life. I can't stress enough the need for frequent dental exams at our office. When you come in for a cleaning, you will actually have two different sets of eyes screening for oral cancer-your hygienist and your dentist.

April is Oral Cancer Awareness Month

Oral cancer is one of the most common yet most preventable cancers. Out of the 70,000 people diagnosed this year with head and neck cancer, 30% of those will involve cancer of the oral cavity. While most people are aware of the link between smoking and lung cancer, few realize that the use of tobacco products is the #1 cause of oral cancer. HPV (human papilloma virus) can infect the mouth and throat and cause cancers of the oropharynx (back of the throat). It is thought to cause 70% or oropharyngeal cancers of the United States.


If detected early the 5-year relative survival rate is approximately 81%. The American Cancer Society and the American Dental Association recommend yearly professional oral exams. The first step in prevention is a careful Continue to page 2



oral exam from your dentist and/or your hygienist. You often wonder why you are asked to "stick your tongue out?" This is why. We are looking for any lumps or bumps that shouldn't be there. Any abnormal discoloring or any different lesions that have been there for awhile, or are not going away, we would want you to go to see an oral surgeon for a biopsy. I haven't seen a lot of oral cancers. There was a time when I noticed an abnormal spot on the side of the tongue, confirmed it with Dr Krista and we gave that patient a referral to see an oral surgeon. It ended up being stage 3 oral cancer and the patient had to undergo surgery. Everything turned out fine and the patient was very appreciative for us "catching

this" This was a great day at the dental office finding this! The moral of this story is to keep your regular appointed dental visits so we can screen for oral cancer.




